## *The Church Compass*

*The Church accompanies us on our journey through life, through the seasons of the year and within the changing circumstances of our daily lives. The following themes can serve as a guide along this path. They can be used individually, as a family or in groups.*

**Remember:** Apart from maybe yourself, do you know anyone who is suffering or being treated for a sickness or disease? Have you ever visited someone in a hospital or nursing home? Which one of the following do you look for in a doctor? A sense of humor to put you at ease? Expertise in their field of treatment? An ability to understand your condition? They treat you as if you were a friend? They also suffered and experienced the condition you are in? They will be brutally honest with you?

**Read:** Mark 1:40-45

**Reflect:** Even though leprosy was a certain death sentence, the leper must have had hope that he could be saved, that his own life was worth saving. He took a great risk seeking out and approaching Jesus. It would mean that the diseased man had to break free from his isolation, carefully navigate himself discreetly through public places and try to find out where Jesus would be and then get close enough without anyone noticing.

**Review:** *From the perspective of the leper, if you could put your finger on it, what do you think was his most enduring suffering?* 1. The physical pain. 2. Having to always accept charity from others. 3. Being lonely. 4. Anger at his condition. 5. Unable to accomplish simple everyday tasks.

**Respond:** *From your own perspective, when are you most likely to pray to Christ?* 1. When no one is looking 2. When I really need a miracle? 3. When I am with others or in a crowd? 4. When it's expected of me? 5. When I am afraid, angry or depressed? 6. I keep myself to a prayer schedule.

## ASH WEDNESDAY-FEBRUARY 14TH

*Masses: 7am and 6pm*

The act of putting on ashes symbolizes fragility and mortality, and the need to be redeemed by the mercy of God. Far from being a merely external act, the Church has retained the use of ashes to symbolize that attitude of internal penance to which all the baptized are called during Lent. Catholics of age 14 and older abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday, and healthy Catholics from age 18-59 fast, limiting themselves to 1 full meal and 2 smaller snacks.
